

Activities

- > Speaker Programs hosted at the Rocky River Nature Center the first Tuesday of each month Sept through May. Presentation topics cover many different aspects of natural science research, discovery, and critical environmental issues. Programs are free and open to the public.
- > Second Saturday Bird Walks in and around the trails of Rocky River Reservation led by expert naturalists. Information on resident and migrant bird populations from these walks are published monthly. Walks are open to the public and welcome birders of all skill levels.
- > Field Trips to various birding locations around northeast Ohio led by knowledgeable leaders. Trips focus on seasonal migrants, resident populations, and newly conserved natural areas.
- > The Christmas Bird Count is an annual event that tallies bird species and numbers in the Lakewood Count Circle. Data is submitted to National Audubon, making it one of the longest running citizen science projects.
- > Northeast Ohio Science and Engineering Fair (NEOSEF) Western Cuyahoga Audubon members judge Science Fair entries and provide awards for conservation or wildlife related projects.
- > Western Cuyahoga Audubon partners and exhibits at the **Wild and Scenic Film Festival** and the **Cleveland International Film Festival**.

Conservation projects

- > We support **public policy issues**, such as the need to restore renewable energy standards in Ohio and advocate for innovative approaches to make buildings safer for birds through promotion of **Lights Out Cleveland**.
- > We conduct discussions on climate change and alternative sources of energy, such as solar power and the proper sighting of wind turbines, to raise public awareness about the need to protect our planet.
- > We sell Shade-Grown Coffee, Birds & Beans®, Smithsonian Bird Friendly®, USDA Organic, Fair-Trade Certified Coffee online and at monthly member meetings.
- > We host outreach events on watershed management, invasive species, night light pollution, and the effect of climate change on birds and habitat.
- > In 2006, Western Cuyahoga Audubon began conducting surveys to collect data on bird populations in the Rocky River Important Bird Area. This is a National Audubon Society designated natural area critical to bird habitat. Cleveland Metroparks works to acquire private property along the East Branch between North Royalton and Hinckley, Ohio to create contiguous parkland around Greater Cleveland. Chapter bird surveys and letters of support serve to bolster park efforts to purchase and conserve such properties.
